What is the Hurontario Light Rail Transit Project?

The Hurontario LRT will be a 20-kilometre, 22-stop light rail service connecting people from the Port Credit GO station to the Brampton Gateway Terminal. The Hurontario LRT will connect with the Port Credit and Cooksville GO stations, Mississauga Transitway, MiWay and Züm transit lines.

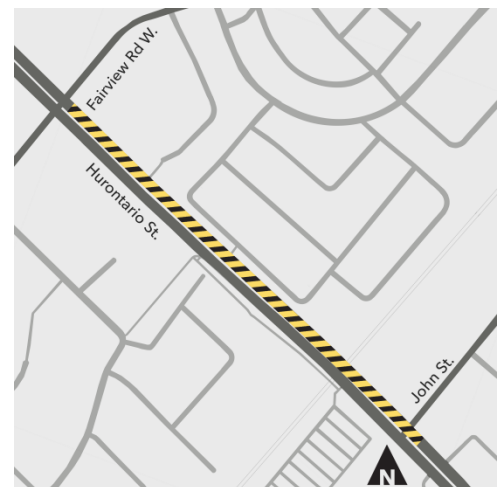
What work is taking place?

To accommodate the construction of the Hurontario LRT, Bell Communications, Rogers Communication Network and Public Sector Network are required to move fiber and coaxial network lines on **Hurontario Street** between **Fairview Road West** and **John Street**.

These cables are integral to the networks feeding your area and must be re-routed to ensure continued high quality reliable service.

Timing

- Due to delays, work is being extended at the location of Hurontario, between Fairview Road West and John Street.
- Work will occur between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday and last for approximately 12 weeks.
- Work could be rescheduled due to weather conditions or any unforeseen circumstances.



Note: at no time will all lanes be closed.

What to Expect

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruption.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

Traffic Details

- During construction hours, lane reductions may be required on Hurontario Street between Fairview Road West and John Street. At a minimum, one northbound and southbound lane will be maintained at all times.
- Traffic delays are expected. Please plan accordingly.
- There will be no impact to property access.

Transit Details

- Due to lane reductions along Hurontario Street between Fairview Avenue West and John Street, delays can be expected on Routes 103 & 19.

Pedestrian Details

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas. Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians as detours may be required.
- Sidewalk access in the area could be affected. Please watch for signage directing pedestrian traffic.

Property Details

- Please ensure any personal belongings, such as signs, benches and underground sprinklers on city owned land have been relocated prior to the beginning of construction.
- For details on your property boundaries, please refer to your land survey, or consult an Ontario Land Surveyor.
