Rouge Hill GO Station Track Maintenance Work

New Track

150 kilometres of new dedicated GO track will allow for more uninterrupted service.



New Trains

New electric trains will travel faster for longer and reduce travel times.



New Bridges and Tunnels

Bridges and tunnels that eliminate intersections with rail and road traffic will provide more reliable GO train service.



New Renovations

New and improved stations will make your journey more comfortable, from start to finish.

THE LOCAL PROJECT – Track Maintenance Work

We will be replacing old rail ties (rectangular wood or concrete support for the rails) with new rail ties at Rouge Hill GO Station on the north track. We will return in September to complete the same work on the south track. This is part of our routine rail corridor state of good repair maintenance program to ensure safety for community members and customers and efficient rail service. The continuous work will begin at approximately **8:00 p.m. on Friday, July 21 until 6:00 a.m. on Monday, July 24**. We understand that this work is disruptive but it can only be completed during overnight hours when there is minimal train activity.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU

Typical construction noise can be expected including back-up beeping from vehicles. The use of specialized rail equipment will result in some vibrations. The work crew will mitigate noise as much as possible and avoid directing lighting at nearby residences. The pedestrian crossing at Chesterton Shores will be used by construction vehicles to access the rail corridor. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times and a flag person will be present to ensure safety. GO Train frequency along the corridor will be reduced to hourly service during the work period.
