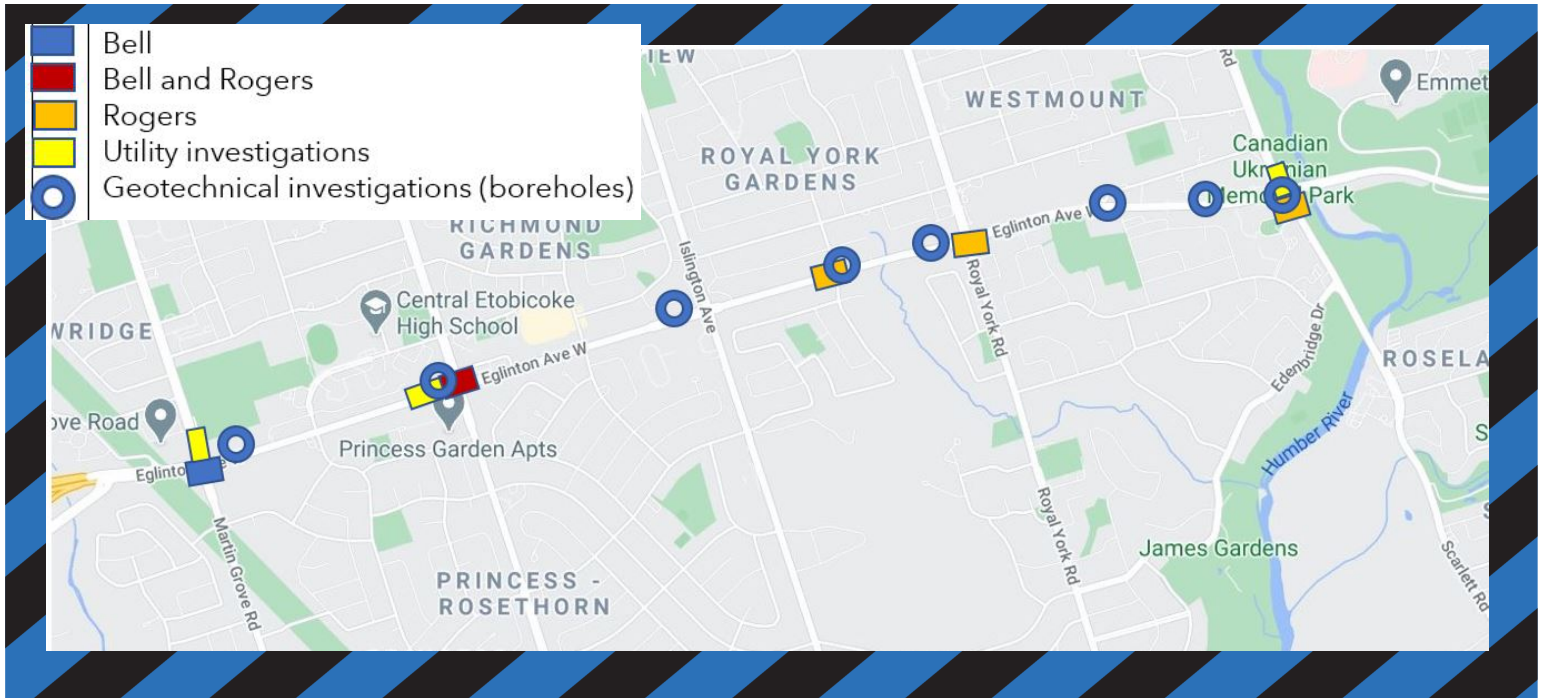


Utility relocation and investigative drilling work between Martin Grove Rd. and Scarlett Rd.

February - September 2021



The Eglinton Crosstown West Extension (ECWE) is one of four new subway projects that will transform transit in our region; getting hundreds of thousands of people where they need to be, better, faster, and easier than today.

What work is happening here?

To help clear the path for the future tunnel boring machine, Bell and Rogers will relocate their lines at intersections along Eglinton Avenue West. Metrolinx is also advancing the design concepts and structural plans for the project by conducting investigative drilling to better understand the underground conditions and utility locations in some areas along the corridor.

Utility relocation and investigations

- Underground Bell and Rogers lines are being relocated between Martin Grove Rd. and Scarlett Rd. to make way for the future tunnel boring machine.
 - Work begins in February and takes place in stages until approximately September.
- Non-intrusive radar-based utility locating work will take place at Martin Grove Rd., Kipling Ave., and Scarlett Rd. Paint markings will note utility locations.
 - Work begins in February and takes approximately 2-weeks to complete.
- Small drill rigs will be used to locate other underground utilities that require road and/or temporary boulevard cuts west of Kipling Ave. Paint markings will note utility locations.
 - Work begins in March and takes approximately 1-week to complete.

Geotechnical investigations (Boreholes)

- A crew will use drill rigs to create new boreholes and monitoring wells between Martin Grove Rd. and Scarlett Rd. This work allows Metrolinx to sample, test and monitor soil conditions which will inform the project design and construction plan.
- Work begins in March and takes approximately 4 weeks to complete.

HOURS OF WORK

- Work can occur between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m, Monday to Friday.
- Work may be rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Residents nearby can expect to hear noise caused by a drill rig, trucks and other equipment.
- Work equipment may be left onsite until the work is completed.

TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN IMPACTS

- During construction hours for the utility work and geotechnical investigations, lane reductions and pedestrian detours may be required.
- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions and expedite work.
