

Utility Relocation and Road Widening on Hurontario Street from Matthews Gate to Eglinton Avenue and on Rathburn Road

Beginning July 2021



What work is taking place?

To accommodate construction of the Hurontario LRT, new watermain, storm and sanitary systems will need to be installed. Alectra and telecommunication infrastructure will also need to be relocated on Hurontario Street. This infrastructure is on the main artery servicing residents and businesses along Hurontario Street between Matthews Gate and Eglinton Avenue and must be re-routed to ensure reliable service to customers.

After utility work is completed, road widening and bridge rehabilitation work will begin. This is to accommodate LRT tracks in the middle of the roadway, and to provide additional support to the existing Hurontario bridge over Highway 403 for the new infrastructure.

TIMING

- Work is scheduled to start in July 2021 and will last approximately one year.
- Work will generally occur between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., Monday to Friday. However, night shifts and weekend works may be scheduled as required.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Lane reductions will be required on Hurontario Street between Matthews Gate to Eglinton Avenue and on Rathburn Road.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Temporary traffic signals will be installed.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Access to properties will be maintained through at least one driveway or with the assistance of a Traffic Control Person.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRANSIT DETAILS

- MiWay will continue to operate with regular service.
- Due to lane reductions along Hurontario Street and Rathburn Road, delays can be expected on MiWay routes 2, 3, 7, 10, 17, 19, 20, 21, 26, 34, 40, 45, 46, 47, 94, 103, 109, 110, 315, 334 and Zum route 502.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.
- A temporary pedestrian pathway will be provided to access the boarding areas.

PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas.
- Sidewalk access in the area could be affected.
- Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians & cyclists as detours may be required.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

PROPERTY DETAILS

- Please ensure any personal belongings, such as signs, benches and underground sprinklers on city owned land have been relocated prior to the beginning of construction.
- For details on your property boundaries, please refer to your land survey, or consult an Ontario Land Surveyor.
