

Tree Protections, Trimming and Removal on Hurontario Street from Park Street to Matheson Boulevard

Beginning August 2021



What work is taking place?

To accommodate construction of the Hurontario LRT, wet and dry utilities need to be installed or relocated.

This work will require the removal of trees within the municipal right-of-way, tree trimming and installation of hoarding to protect trees near construction. Metrolinx and Mobilinx recognize that trees are very important and are working closely with the City of Mississauga to help identify planting and compensation requirements for tree removal on both city and private property. Trees will only be removed when necessary.

Work is also underway to install temporary bus platforms, implement lane reductions, and set up construction fencing in preparation for utility relocation work. Please lookout for signage guiding pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists.

TIMING

- Work is scheduled to start in August 2021.
- Work will occur between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., Monday to Friday. However, night shifts and weekend works may be scheduled as required.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Lane reductions will be required on Hurontario Street between Park Street and Matheson Boulevard.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Orange fencing or wooden boards will be installed for tree protection.
- Property owners will be contacted if trees on private property need to be protected, trimmed, or removed.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRANSIT DETAILS

- MiWay will continue to operate with regular service.

- Due to lane reductions along Hurontario Street, delays can be expected on MiWay routes 2, 3, 4, 21, 53, 103 and 302.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.
- A temporary pedestrian pathway will be provided to access the boarding areas.
- Visit www.bramptontransit.com or www.miway.ca/updates for updates on your bus route.

PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas.
- Sidewalk access in the area could be affected.
- Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians & cyclists as detours may be required.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

PROPERTY DETAILS

- Access to properties will always be maintained through at least one driveway or with the assistance of a Traffic Control Person.
- Please ensure any personal belongings, such as signs, benches and underground sprinklers on city owned land have been relocated prior to the beginning of construction.
- For details on your property boundaries, please refer to your land survey, or consult an Ontario Land Surveyor.
