

# Partial Intersection Closures for Track Installations along Hurontario Street

Aldridge Street/Traders Boulevard: October 4 - October 27, 2022  
Matheson Boulevard: October 28 - December 15, 2022



## What work is taking place?

For the construction of the LRT, tracks will be laid along the centre guideway of Hurontario Street between Matheson Boulevard and Britannia Road, requiring partial east-west intersection closures or additional left-turn restrictions in the area. The partial closure at **Aldridge Street/Traders Boulevard and Hurontario Street is scheduled from October 4, 2022 until October 27, 2022**. East-west traffic as well as left-turns will be restricted during this time.

Track installations at **Matheson Boulevard and Hurontario Street from October 28, 2022 until December 15, 2022** occur within two sub-stages. In the first stage, the north side of the intersection will be closed from October 28, 2022 to November 19, 2022. This will be followed by the south side from November 19, 2022 to December 15, 2022. During these stages, east-west traffic will be maintained along Matheson Boulevard, but reduced to a single lane in each direction. Left-turns at this intersection will not be permitted. In order to weld tracks together and form the concrete, it will be necessary to partially close the Matheson/Hurontario intersection to eastbound and westbound traffic. East/west traffic will be detoured to Milverton Drive/Watline Avenue. During these east/west closures, traffic will continue to travel north and south on Hurontario. **The first partial closure will be from November 25, 2022 until November 28, 2022. The second will be from December 10, 2022 to December 11, 2022.** Please visit [www.miway.ca/updates](http://www.miway.ca/updates) for updates on your bus route.

Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances. Please watch for signage in the area for any updates. Construction occurs at every other intersection to allow for motorist and transit detours.

Construction work at these intersections is scheduled for 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Two northbound lanes, two southbound lanes and right-turn movements will be primarily maintained on Hurontario Street. Motorists, including emergency vehicles, will not be able to cross Hurontario Street except at major arterial roads, including left-turns, at these intersections and are encouraged to follow signed detour routes. Pedestrian crossings of Hurontario Street will be maintained at a signalized crosswalk. Traffic signal timings will be adjusted to keep people moving.

## TIMING

- Work at Aldridge Street/Traders Boulevard is scheduled from October 4, 2022 until October 27, 2022
- Work at Matheson Boulevard is scheduled from October 28, 2022 until December 15, 2022
- Construction is scheduled to occur 24/7
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

## TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Eastbound and westbound movements will not be permitted across the Aldridge Street/Traders Boulevard.
- Eastbound and westbound through traffic and right-turns will be maintained, but left turns will not be permitted at Matheson Boulevard.
- A partial intersection closure east and westbound at Matheson Boulevard with only right turns is scheduled from November 25, 2022 until November 28, 2022, and December 10, 2022, until December 11, 2022 (tentative).
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Temporary traffic signal heads will be bagged to align with the lane closures.

## TRANSIT IMPACT DETAILS

- Due to construction activities along Hurontario Street, delays can be expected on Züm route 502 and MiWay routes 17, 25, 43 70, and 103.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.

## WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Access to properties will be maintained.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

## PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Please take care when walking or cycling near construction areas and watch for additional signs directing the public such as detours and dismounting.
- Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians across Hurontario Street as only one east/west crosswalk will be provided at all Hurontario Street intersections.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

## PROPERTY DETAILS

- Crews will not require property access for track installation.
