<p>1. RFQ: Local construction knowledge section - there is an opportunity to look at including considerations for Community Relations criteria in the future templates.</p>	<p>The request has been forwarded to Legal Counsel at Infrastructure Ontario for consideration. At this time, the current RFQ template will remain the same.</p>
<p>2. Consider raising questions about updating the noise and vibration standards currently held by the Ministry of Environment.</p>	<p>Community members interested in requesting an update to the protocol can contact the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP), who is responsible for the Ontario Government's provincial protocol - known as the Ontario Ministry of Environment and Energy (MOEE)/GO Transit Draft Protocol for Noise and Vibration Assessment (1995). http://www.infogo.gov.on.ca/infogo/home.html#orgProfile/707/en</p>

Infrastructure Ontario to explore if a redacted RFP template can be provided to the CAC for their input on community concerns including support services such as a 24-hour live hotline, etc.</p>	<p>Infrastructure Ontario consulted with the Project Team, Legal Counsel and Procurement Team. Since this procurement is still in market - providing a redacted RFP is not possible at this time. Metrolinx suggests the CAC continues with drafting a list of concerns that can be reviewed during the preliminary RFP process. Recommend the CAC provide the list to Metrolinx mid-September 2018.</p>
