

Investigative drilling work along Danforth Ave Between Pape Ave to Eaton Ave.

Starting as early as June 27, 2022



What is happening?

MetroLinx will be using drill rigs and trucks to gather information and evaluate underground conditions. Using this information, MetroLinx can determine the construction approach for this project.



Timing

- **Scheduled start:**
June 27, 2022
- **Duration:**
6 Weeks
- **Work Expected to be completed by August 4, 2022**
- **Days:** Weekdays
(No work on Canada Day)
- **Hours:** 8 a.m.-5 p.m.



What to expect

- The work crew will be drilling three (3) boreholes along Danforth between Pape Ave and Eaton Ave.
- A section of the westbound curb side lane will be closed during this drilling work. Barricades will be set up around the borehole and the work area will be clearly marked for passing pedestrians and traffic. Please see the work area outlined in the above map.
- Equipment will be left on-site outside of work hours within the fenced area.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by a drill rig, trucks and other construction equipment related to this work.
- No sidewalk or bike lane closures are expected during this drilling work.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
