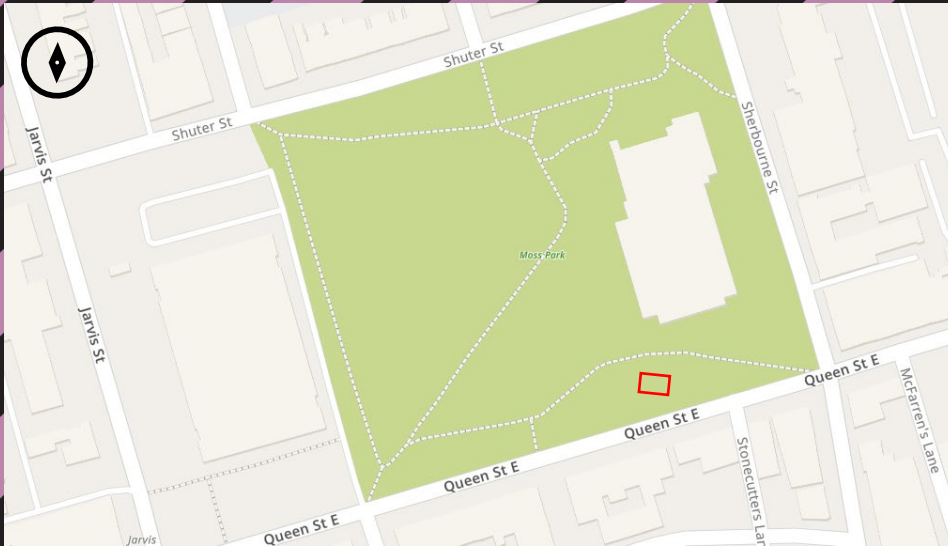


Investigative drilling work at Moss Park near Queen Street and Sherbourne Street

Starting as early as May 19, 2022



What is happening?

MetroInx will be using small drill rigs and trucks to gather information and evaluate underground conditions. Using this information, MetroInx can determine the construction approach for this project.



Timing

- **Scheduled start:** May 19, 2022
- **Duration:** Up to three weeks
- **Days:** Weekdays
- **Hours:** 8 a.m.–5 p.m.



What to expect

- The work crew will be drilling a borehole in the south section of Moss Park, near the Queen Street and Sherbourne Street intersection.
- An area of Moss Park will be closed during this drilling work. Barricades will be set up around the borehole and the work area will be clearly marked for passing pedestrians and traffic. Please see the work area outlined in the above map.
- Equipment will be left on-site outside of work hours within the fenced area.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by a drill rig, trucks and other construction equipment related to this work.
- No sidewalk or traffic lane closures are expected during this drilling work.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
