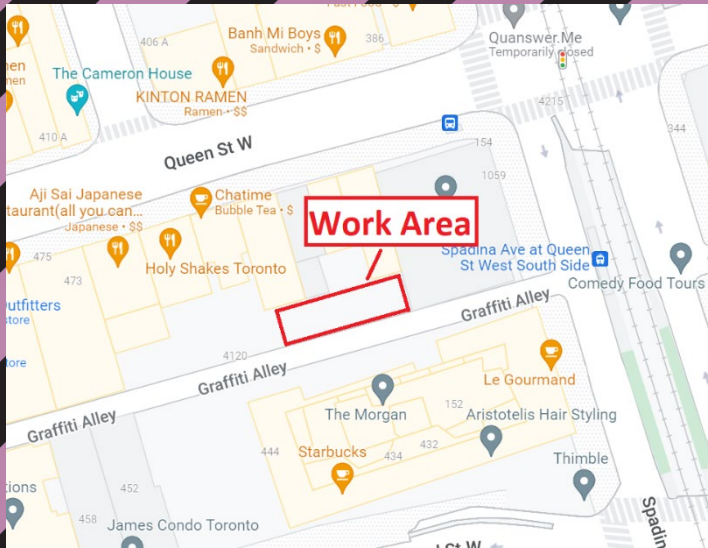


Geotechnical Drilling and Hydrovac work near Graffiti Alley

Starting as early as November 15th, 2022



What is happening?

In order to connect more people and places throughout Toronto, work is underway to deliver the new Ontario Line from the Science Centre to Exhibition Station.

Crews will be conducting drilling and hydrovac work in the area of Graffiti Alley, near the intersection of Queen St W and Spadina Ave to facilitate construction of the future Ontario Line station in this area.



Timing

- **Scheduled start:**
November 15th, 2022
- **Scheduled Completion Date:**
December 16th, 2022
- **Days:** Weekdays
- **Work Hours:**
7 a.m. - 7 p.m.



What to expect

- Work crews will be conducting investigative drilling and hydrovac work on Graffiti Alley, near the intersection of Queen St W and Spadina
- A hydrovac truck will be on-site and used for the excavation work.
- Drums will be left on-site outside of work hours. These will be labeled and sealed to ensure safety.
- The alley will not be blocked off to traffic or pedestrians during the work period.
- Residents and businesses near the sites may hear noise from the work crews and equipment typical to a high-idle truck.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.
