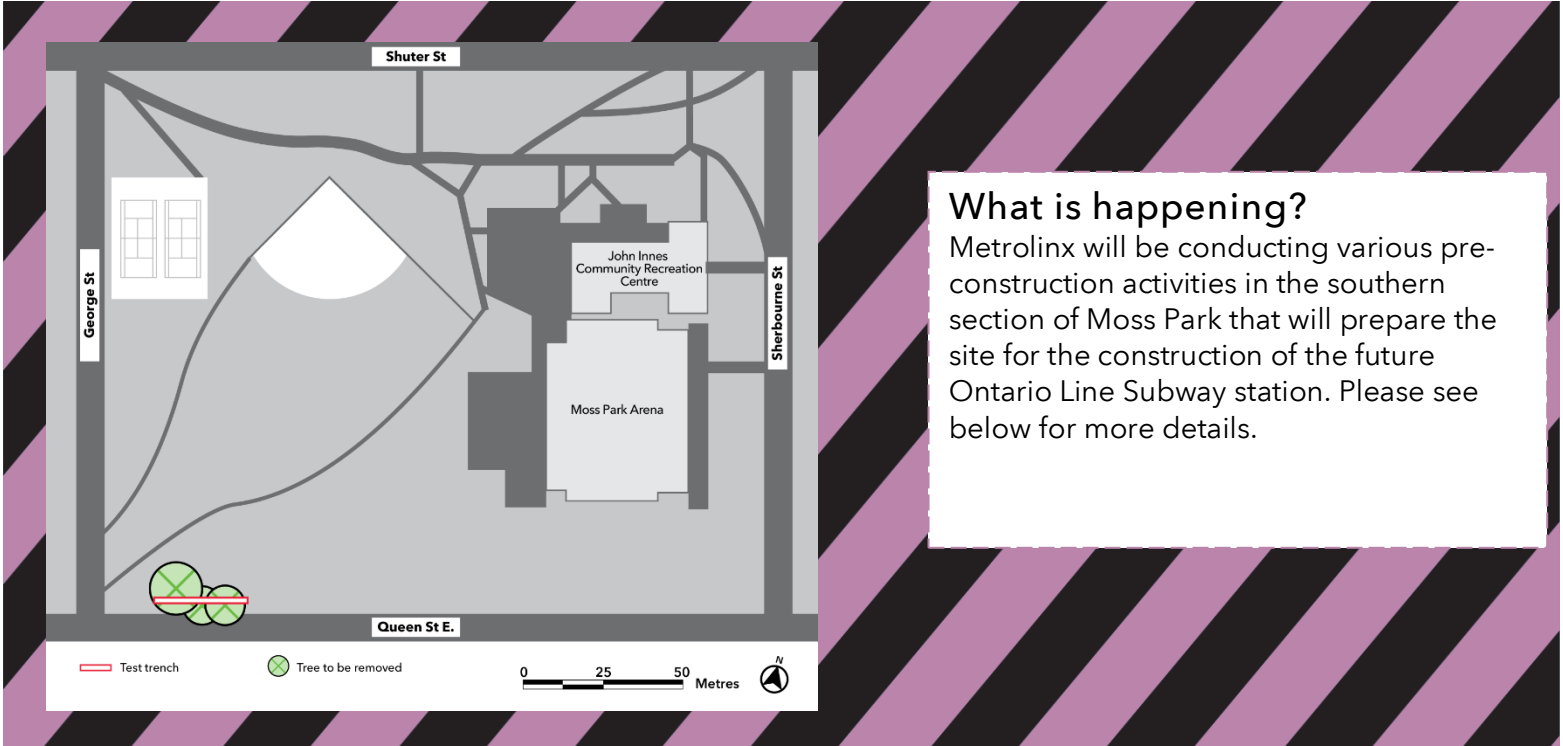


Ongoing Archeological Work at Moss Park

Starting as early as October 3rd, 2022



What is happening?

MetroLinx will be conducting various pre-construction activities in the southern section of Moss Park that will prepare the site for the construction of the future Ontario Line Subway station. Please see below for more details.

Timing


- **Scheduled start:** October 3rd, 2022
- **Scheduled completion:** October 20th, 2022
- **Days:** Approx. 17 days
- **Hours:** Approx. 8 a.m.-5p.m.

What to expect

- Crews will be continuing to conduct work within the southern portion of Moss Park. Work includes:
 - Archaeological Assessment
 - Removal of 2-3 Trees
- Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment: As part of the ongoing archeological work, one trench will be excavated in the area indicated in the above map. This work will take 13-14 days.
- Trenches will be excavated using a mechanical excavator under the guidance and observation of a licensed archaeologist, in accordance with the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport’s 2011 Standards and Guidelines. Trenches will be backfilled following the assessment.

- Two (2) or three (3) trees will be removed to accommodate the archaeological trenching (as shown on the map). This work will take 2-3 days.
- For safety, temporary fencing will be installed around the work area.
- Tree protections will be in place for the remaining trees, in accordance with conditions of the City of Toronto's Parks and Urban Forestry guidelines, Permit To Injure or Destroy/Remove Trees.
- Residents and businesses near the work site may hear noise caused by trucks and other construction equipment related to this work.
- Work equipment may be left on-site until work is complete.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.
- Please take care near the construction area and watch for signs directing pedestrians.
