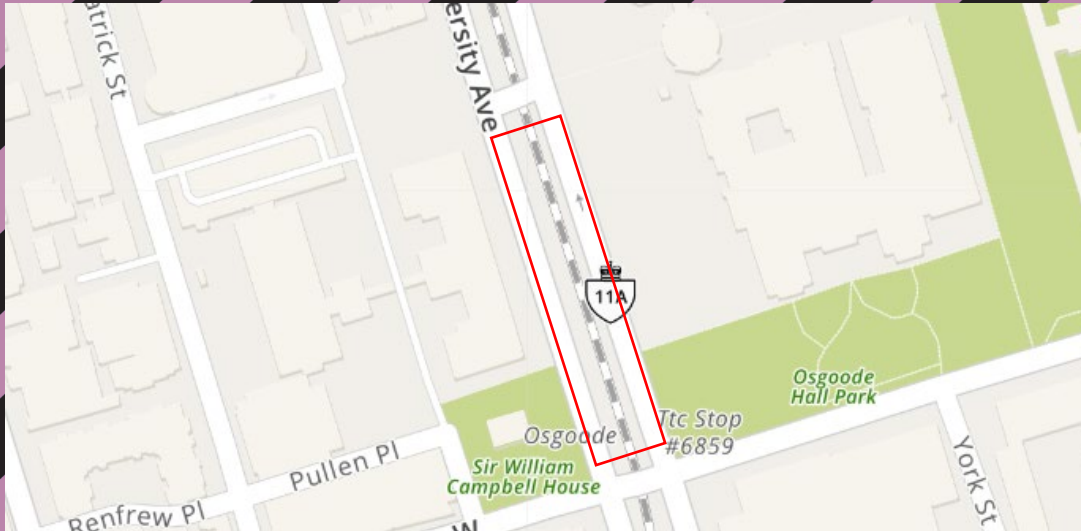


Overnight investigative drilling work at Queen Street West and University Avenue

Starting as early as July 18, 2022



What is happening?
 Metrolinx will be using small drill rigs and trucks to gather information and evaluate underground conditions. Using this information, Metrolinx can determine the construction approach for this project.



Timing



- **Scheduled start:** July 18, 2022
- **Duration:** Up to five weeks
- **Days:** Weekdays
- **Hours:** 9 p.m.-5 a.m.

What to expect

- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by a drill rig, trucks and other construction equipment related to this work.
 - **Week 1:** A hydraulic vacuum (hydrovac) truck will be used to confirm utility locations.
 - **Week 2 onward:** Boreholes will be drilled in multiple locations within the public right-of-way to further investigations.
- A paid duty officer and flagging crew will help direct traffic. Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- At one drilling location, the sidewalk will be narrowed, however no impacts to pedestrians are expected.
- No work equipment will be left on-site.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
