
Overnight water level monitoring on Queen Street between James Street and Victoria Street

Starting as early as June 1, 2022







Duration: Three days

Days: Weekdays

Hours: 7 p.m.-5 a.m.



What to expect

- The westbound curb lane on Queen Street East will be closed during this work. During work on James Street, crews will occupy a curb lane. A traffic control person and flagging crew will be on-site to help direct traffic. Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- No impacts to pedestrians or sidewalks are expected.
- No noise or vibration impacts are expected, as crews will use hand tools to take measurements and collect samples from previously installed monitoring wells.
- Drums will be used to store any excess water and will be properly labelled. Drums will be temporarily stored along the curb until the work is completed. One drum will be stored on Queen Street West, east of James Street beside a streetlight. The other will be stored on Queen Street East (between Victoria and Yonge) beside a streetlight.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
