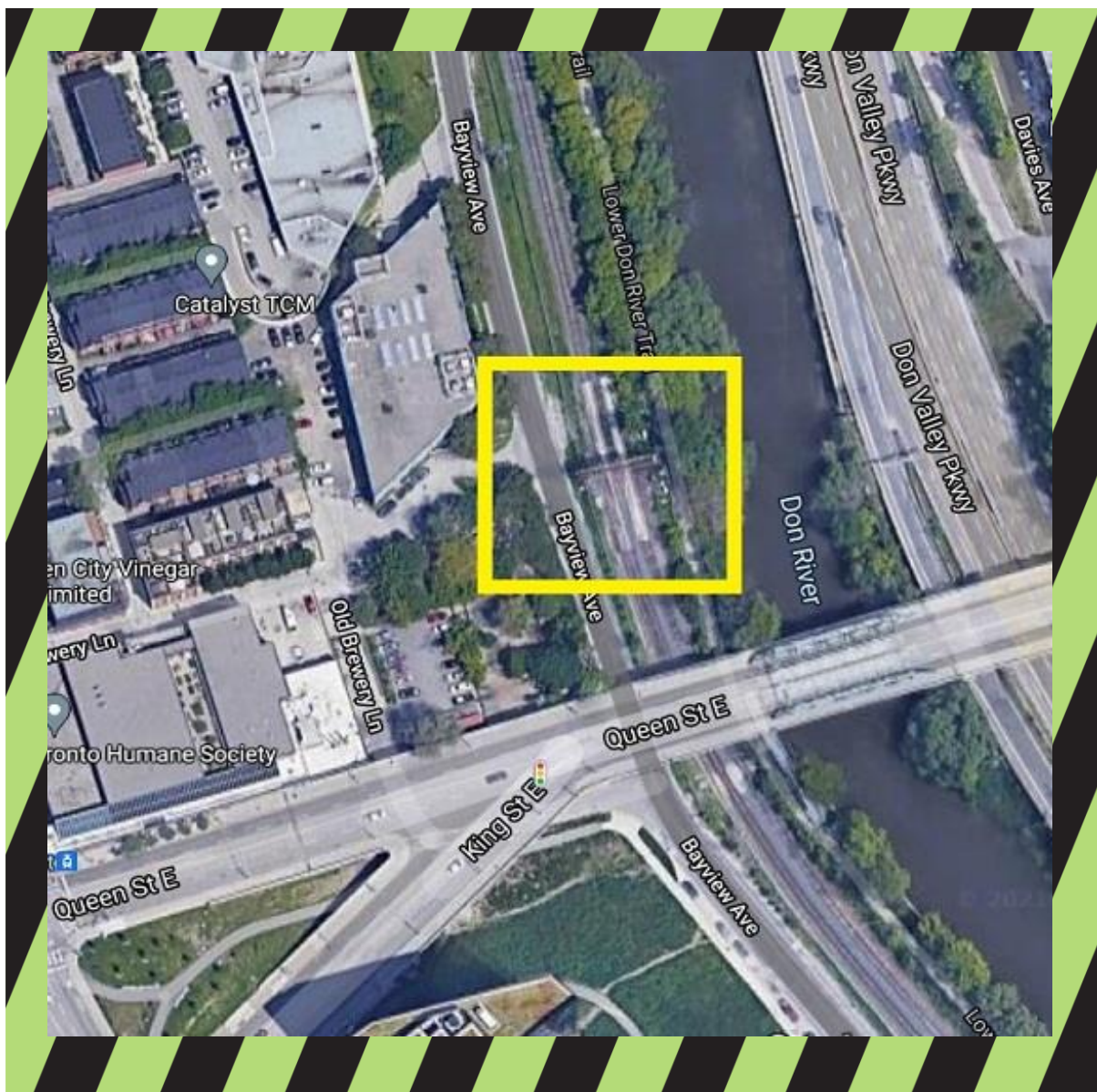


Signal Bridge Demolition and Cabling Work Weekend

What's Going On?

Metrolinx continues performing early works leading up to new signal communication bridges, scheduled for installation at various locations within the East Union Station Rail Corridor beginning later this year. The weekend of July 9-12, the signal bridge just west of Corktown Common Park adjacent to Bayview Avenue will be demolished, and associated cabling work will be performed. Continuous hours of operation will begin on at 8 p.m. Friday evening and continue until 6 a.m. Monday morning. **Dates may change according to conditions. Safety first.**

How Will You Be Affected?

Heavy machinery such as vacuum trucks, excavators, jackhammers, boom trucks, and corridor lighting will be used. Metrolinx is working with subcontractors to mitigate impacts by using white noise backup beepers and redirecting lighting away from nearby windows when possible.

Crews will be using the entrance near the Corktown Dog Park (LE54), and the public will witness equipment mobilization around Corktown Common Park.

USRC Signalling System Project Overview

The USRC Signalling System Project is designed to improve reliability of our signalling and train control systems and will replace the functionality of locally controlled towers at Cherry, Scott, and John Streets.

Early works continue in preparation for new signal bridges at various locations within the Union Station Rail Corridor. Construction and enabling works are estimated to be completed in late 2022.
